A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Creation of a State Debt - Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2005**
 3 **and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 2000, 2002, 2003, and**
 4 **2004**

5 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of Six
 6 Hundred Sixty-Five Million, ~~Three Hundred Thirty Five~~ Four Hundred
 7 Forty-Three Thousand Dollars ~~(\$665,335,000)~~ (\$665,443,000) the proceeds to be
 8 used for certain necessary building, construction, demolition, planning,
 9 renovation, conversion, replacement, and capital equipment purchases of this
 10 State, for acquiring certain real estate in connection therewith, and for grants to
 11 certain subdivisions and other organizations for certain purposes, subject to the
 12 requirement that certain grantees provide certain matching funds of a certain
 13 type by a certain date; providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds
 14 evidencing the loan; providing for certain unexpended appropriations in prior
 15 capital budgets and bond loan acts to be expended for other public projects;
 16 altering certain requirements for certain programs in prior capital budget acts;
 17 providing that the authorizations of State Debt in certain prior capital budgets
 18 and bond loan acts be reduced by certain amounts; providing for certain
 19 additional information to be detailed about each project in the capital program;
 20 repealing a requirement for a certain appropriation; and generally relating to
 21 the financing of certain capital projects.

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
 12 MARYLAND, That:

13 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on
 14 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland
 15 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2005 in the total principal amount of ~~\$665,335,000~~
 16 \$665,443,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State
 17 general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and
 18 issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with Sections 8-117 through 8-124 of the
 19 State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, Section 22 of the Code.

20 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as
 21 a single issue of bonds under Section 8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement
 22 Article.

23 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer
 24 and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and
 25 delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then
 26 shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the
 27 Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable
 28 architects' and engineers' fees:
