1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Commission on Civic Literacy**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing a Commission on Civic Literacy; establishing the
4 membership of the Commission; requiring the Commission to elect certain
5 officers from among its members; requiring the State Department of Education
6 to provide staff and certain other support to the Commission; prohibiting a
7 member of the Commission from receiving certain compensation, but
8 authorizing a member of the Commission to receive certain reimbursements;
9 requiring the Commission to hold certain meetings; authorizing the Commission
10 to hold additional meetings under certain circumstances; requiring certain
11 officials to jointly call the first meeting of the Commission; requiring the

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

25 **CHAIR, VICE CHAIR, AND ANY OTHER OFFICERS NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT ITS**

27 ~~**(C)**~~ **(D) THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION SHALL PROVIDE STAFF**
28 **AND OTHER NECESSARY SUPPORT TO THE COMMISSION USING EXISTING**
29 **RESOURCES.**

1 ~~(D)~~ (E) A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION MAY NOT RECEIVE
2 COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION, BUT IS ENTITLED TO
3 REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE STANDARD STATE TRAVEL
4 REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

5 ~~(E)~~ (F) THE COMMISSION SHALL MEET AT LEAST TWICE EACH YEAR AND
6 MAY HOLD ADDITIONAL MEETINGS AT THE DISCRETION OF THE CHAIR OR AT
7 THE REQUEST OF A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS. THE PRESIDENT OF THE
8 SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES ACTING JOINTLY
9 SHALL CALL THE FIRST MEETING OF THE COMMISSION.

11 (1) DEVELOP AND COORDINATE PROGRAMS IN COLLABORATION
12 WITH SCHOOLS TO EDUCATE STUDENTS IN THE IMPORTANCE OF:

13 (I) REASONED DEBATE, GOOD FAITH, NEGOTIATION, AND
14 COMPROMISE IN REPRESENTATIVE DEMOCRACY;

15 (II) INDIVIDUAL INVOLVEMENT IN CREATING SUCCESSFUL
16 COMMUNITIES; AND

17 (III) CONSIDERATION AND RESPECT FOR OTHERS IN
18 DELIBERATING, NEGOTIATING, AND ADVOCATING POSITIONS ON PUBLIC
19 CONCERNS;

20 (2) IDENTIFY CIVIC EDUCATION PROJECTS IN MARYLAND AND
21 PROVIDE TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO THOSE PROJECTS AS NEEDED;

22 (3) BUILD A NETWORK OF EDUCATION PROFESSIONALS TO SHARE
23 INFORMATION AND STRENGTHEN PARTNERSHIPS;

24 (4) CONSULT WITH ORGANIZATIONS REPRESENTED ON THE
25 COMMISSION AS APPROPRIATE;

26 (5) DEVELOP A CLEARINGHOUSE THAT SHALL BE AVAILABLE ON
27 THE INTERNET TO INCLUDE:

1 (I) A DATABASE OF CIVIC EDUCATION RESOURCES, LESSON
2 PLANS, AND OTHER PROGRAMS AND BEST PRACTICES IN CIVIC EDUCATION;

3 (II) A BULLETIN BOARD TO PROMOTE DISCUSSION OF IDEAS
4 RELATING TO CIVIC EDUCATION;

5 (III) AN EVENTS CALENDAR; AND

6 (IV) LINKS TO CIVIC EDUCATION RESEARCH;

7 (6) SUPPORT SUCCESSFUL CIVIC EDUCATION PROGRAMS IN
8 MARYLAND AND ENCOURAGE THE EXPANSION OF THOSE PROGRAMS; AND

9 (7) REPORT ON ITS ACTIVITIES TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN
10 ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE
11 GENERAL ASSEMBLY, ANNUALLY ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1 OF EACH YEAR.

12 ~~(G)~~ (H) THE COMMISSION MAY:

13 (1) SEEK, ACCEPT, AND EXPEND FUNDS FROM ANY SOURCE,
14 INCLUDING DONATIONS, STATE APPROPRIATIONS, AND FEDERAL GRANTS; AND

15 (2) SEEK, ACCEPT, AND USE SERVICES FROM INDIVIDUALS,
16 CORPORATIONS, AND GOVERNMENT ENTITIES.

17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
18 October 1, 2007. It shall remain effective for a period of 5 years and, at the end of
19 September 30, 2012, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act
20 shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
