**CRIMINAL PROCEDURE ARTICLE ADDITIONS – CROSS-
REFERENCES AND CORRECTIONS**

Correcting specified cross-references to new Title 15 and new Title 16 of the Criminal Procedure Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland that revise provisions of law that relate to the Office of the State Prosecutor, the Office of the State’s Attorney, and the Office of the Public Defender.

CRIMINAL PROCEDURE ARTICLE ADDITIONS

Adding three new titles to the Criminal Procedure Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, to be designated and known as “Title 14. Office of the State Prosecutor”, “Title 15. Office of the State’s Attorney”, and “Title 16. Office of the Public Defender”; revising, restating, and recodifying specified laws applicable to the Office of the State Prosecutor, the Office of the State’s Attorney, and the Office of the Public Defender; etc.

Altering the factors a juvenile court is required to consider in making specified findings in permanency planning and review hearings; increasing, from 7 to 10, the number of days' notice a local department of social services is required to give to specified persons before permanency planning and review hearings; requiring the court to consult with the child on the record in an age appropriate manner at least every 12 months at a permanency planning or review hearing; etc.

STATE ARCHIVES – RECORDS AND OTHER SERVICES – FEES

Authorizing the State Archivist to establish reasonable fees for the care and preservation of records and other services; providing that these fees may be in specified forms; requiring a specified percentage of these fees to be deposited in the Archives Endowment Account of the State Archives Fund; etc.

Chapter 20 **and Management)**

STATE PERSONNEL – ACCRUAL AND CARRYOVER OF ANNUAL LEAVE

Increasing from 50 to 75 days and from 400 to 600 hours the number of days and hours of annual leave that State employees may accumulate and carry over from one calendar year to the next calendar year; etc.

Chapter 24 **(By Request – Departmental – Ethics, State Commission on)**

STATE ETHICS COMMISSION – ELECTRONIC FILING UNDER

Clarifying that, for purposes of specified financial disclosure statements and reports filed electronically with the State Ethics Commission, certain oaths and affirmations must be made by electronic signature that subjects the individual making the electronic signature to the penalties of perjury.

Chapter 25 **Administration, Maryland)**

MARYLAND HEALTH INSURANCE PLAN – APPLICATION OF
INSURANCE FRAUD LAW

Providing that specified provisions of law relating to fraudulent insurance acts that apply to insurers also apply to the Maryland Health Insurance Plan.

Changing the requirements for the Personnel Officer of Anne Arundel County to request State and national criminal records checks from the Criminal Justice Information System Central Repository for a prospective or current employee or volunteer; requiring the Personnel Officer to submit specified items to the Central Repository; requiring the Central Repository to forward the criminal history information to the prospective or current employee or volunteer and the Personnel Officer; etc.

Chapter 40 **Conference)**

DISTRICT COURT – COMMISSIONERS – JURISDICTION

Authorizing a District Court commissioner to exercise the powers of that office in any county to which the commissioner is assigned by the Chief Judge of the District Court or a designee of the Chief Judge of the District Court; authorizing the Chief Judge of the District Court or a designee of the Chief Judge of the District Court to assign a commissioner to serve temporarily in any county; repealing specified limitations on an assignment of a District Court commissioner; etc.

Requiring bottled water to meet specified federal standards of identity; requiring specified labeling requirements to conform to specified federal regulations; repealing the out-of-state registration requirements for bottled water and soft drinks; etc.

Repealing the bedding law in the State.

Requiring the Department of Natural Resources to adopt regulations defining which species may be harvested, imported, transported, sold, or used as bait; repealing specified provisions of law governing the application process for a live bait dealer's license; repealing specified restrictions on live bait dealers and live bait purchasers; etc.

Applying specified provisions of law to health maintenance organizations; requiring the Maryland Insurance Commissioner to adopt regulations that may be applied in emergencies or disasters; authorizing the regulations to apply to any person regulated by the Commissioner and to address specified activities; requiring that in order to activate a specified regulation, the Commissioner must issue a bulletin containing specified information; etc.

Authorizing the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation to directly collect from employers the federal unemployment insurance tax under specified circumstances; requiring that funds derived from the collection of the tax be used only for the programs and services administered by the Office of Unemployment Insurance and the Office of Employment Services; providing for a specified review by the Joint Committee on Unemployment Insurance Oversight; etc.

Chapter 79**Delegate Pendergrass, et al****HEALTH CARE DECISIONS ACT – ADVANCE DIRECTIVES –
ELECTRONIC DOCUMENTS AND ELECTRONIC SIGNATURES**

Establishing, for purposes of the Health Care Decisions Act, that an electronic signature shall have the same effect as a manual signature, if the electronic signature meets specified requirements; authorizing a competent individual to make an electronic advance directive; authorizing an advance directive to be revoked electronically; defining the terms “electronic signature” and “signed”; altering the definition of “advance directive” to include electronic documents; etc.

Requiring nursing homes to establish a safe patient lifting workgroup composed of specified members on or before December 1, 2008; requiring the workgroup to establish a safe patient lifting policy on or before July 1, 2009; requiring the workgroup to consider specified factors while developing a safe patient lifting policy; etc.

Altering the duties of the County Clerk of Washington County; repealing a provision requiring the County Clerk to receive from the Tax Collector of Washington County specified interest coupons on the bonded indebtedness of the county and specified bonds due and redeemed by the Tax Collector; repealing a requirement that the County Clerk cancel specified coupons and bonds; repealing a requirement that the County Clerk make a specified report to the County Commissioners of Washington County; etc.

Requiring that a specified notice of cancellation of specified binders or policies of insurance be sent by certificate of mail.

Labor, Licensing and Regulation)****FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS – REGULATORY REFORMS**

Substituting a notice requirement for an application by a banking institution or credit union to install an automated teller machine; establishing an exception to the notice requirement; increasing the minimum amount of capital required to charter specified commercial banks; altering a civil penalty imposed on a banking institution or other-state bank for failing to make a specified report or failing to submit specified proof; etc.

Authorizing a person in Washington County to hunt deer on specified Sundays on private property with a bow and arrow during October and November; etc.

Chapter 95**Chair, Economic Matters Committee (By Request – Departmental – Insurance Administration, Maryland)****PROPERTY AND CASUALTY INSURANCE POLICIES – COVERAGE FOR ADDITIONAL LIVING EXPENSES**

Prohibiting specified language limiting coverage for additional living expenses incurred by an insured as a result of a covered loss in a policy of homeowner's, fire, farmowner's, or dwelling insurance; specifying that specified language in a policy of homeowner's, fire, farmowner's, or dwelling insurance is void; providing that specified actions by an insurer are not prohibited under the Act; authorizing the Maryland Insurance Commissioner to require that an insurer provide specified coverage for living expenses; etc.

Applying the occupational disease presumption under the workers' compensation law to park police officers employed by the Maryland–National Capital Park and Planning Commission (MNCPPC) who contract Lyme disease under specified circumstances; providing that a specified presumption only applies for a specified period of time under specified circumstances; and providing that officers who are eligible for benefits under the Act shall receive the benefits in addition to specified retirement benefits, subject to a specified adjustment.

Repealing the termination date for removing Montgomery County from the list of counties in which deer hunting on private lands on specified Sundays is prohibited; etc.

Altering the threshold amount above which the Oakmont Citizens' Committee is required to advertise for bids for the purchase of materials or contract for work; providing for an exception to advertising for competitive bids under specified circumstances; etc.

Providing that before the Housing Opportunities Commission of Montgomery County may solicit a specified service contract, the Executive Director of the Commission must provide specified certification; requiring the Commission to compare specified costs under specified circumstances; authorizing the certified representative of an adversely affected Commission employee to submit a proposal in response to a specified solicitation; etc.

Chapter 104 **Departmental – Natural Resources)****FOREST CONSERVATION – REPORTING AND ENFORCEMENT**

Requiring specified local authorities to report enforcement activity relating to forest conservation requirements to the Department of Natural Resources within 15 days after commencement of the enforcement activity; and requiring specified enforcement activities to be included in the Department's annual forest conservation report.

Chapter 105 **Departmental – Agriculture)****MARYLAND AGRICULTURAL LAND PRESERVATION PROGRAM – LOT RELEASES**

Requiring that releases from easement restrictions issued by the Maryland Agricultural Land Preservation Foundation (MALPF) include a statement acknowledging the status of adjacent farmland; and altering the size of lots that may be released from easement restrictions by MALPF under specified circumstances.

Requiring a person who possesses evidence of a release of a hazardous substance under specified circumstances to report the finding immediately to the Department of the Environment; requiring the Department to adopt regulations by June 30, 2009, to determine the reportable threshold of a release of a hazardous substance; etc.

Authorizing an exemption from the school facilities surcharge in Prince George’s County for construction of a single-family dwelling unit that is to replace on the same lot a previously existing single-family dwelling unit destroyed by fire, explosion, or a natural disaster.

Providing for enhanced workers’ compensation benefits for specified Prince George’s County correctional officers for a permanent partial disability award for less than a specified number of weeks.

Curing a previous Act of the General Assembly, erroneously enacted as part of the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2007, by repealing and reenacting without amendments a provision of law to provide for an increase in the total principal amount of bonds that may be issued by the local governing body of a code county; etc.

Chapter 112**Delegate Feldman, et al****CONSUMER PROTECTION – HALAL FOOD PRODUCTS**

Requiring specified persons that represent to the public that any unpackaged food that is sold or served is halal to prominently and conspicuously display on the premises a specified disclosure statement; requiring the Division of Consumer Protection of the Office of the Attorney General to develop and make available a form for the disclosure statements; requiring the disclosure statement to contain specified information; prohibiting the false representation of food as halal; etc.

Chapter 113**Washington County Delegation****WASHINGTON COUNTY – REGULATION OF SPECIAL EVENTS**

Prohibiting persons, corporations, partnerships, associations, and entities from holding specified events without first obtaining a special event permit; authorizing the Board of County Commissioners of Washington County to adopt regulations by ordinance or resolution concerning special event permit applications, processes, fees, penalties, appeal procedures, and exceptions; and exempting specified events from the provisions of the Act.

Authorizing the Commissioner of Labor and Industry to collect specified employee data; authorizing the Commissioner to analyze specified records to study pay disparity issues; requiring the Commissioner to provide a specified report to the General Assembly; and terminating the Act at the end of December 31, 2013.
