CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Ethics – Executive Branch – Lobbying by Former Officials**

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting certain former Executive Branch officials from
4 engaging in certain employment for a certain period of time; providing
5 exceptions to the employment prohibition; and generally relating to lobbying by
6 former Executive Branch officials.

7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article – State Government**

15 15–504.

16 (d) (1) Except for a former member of the General Assembly, who shall be
17 subject to the restrictions provided under paragraph (2) of this subsection, a former

1 official or employee may not assist or represent a party, other than the State, in a
2 case, contract, or other specific matter for compensation if:

3 (i) the matter involves State government; and

4 (ii) the former official or employee participated significantly in
5 the matter as an official or employee.

6 (2) (i) Except as provided in subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph,
7 until the conclusion of the next regular session that begins after the member leaves
8 office, a former member of the General Assembly may not assist or represent another
9 party for compensation in a matter that is the subject of legislative action.

10 (ii) The limitation under subparagraph (i) of this paragraph on
11 representation by a former member of the General Assembly does not apply to the
12 former member's representation of a municipal corporation, county, or State
13 governmental entity.

14 **(3) (I) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS**
15 **PARAGRAPH, FOR 1 YEAR AFTER THE OFFICIAL LEAVES EMPLOYMENT, A**
16 **FORMER STATE OFFICIAL OR PUBLIC OFFICIAL OF THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH**
17 **MAY NOT ASSIST OR REPRESENT ANOTHER PARTY FOR COMPENSATION IN A**
18 **MATTER THAT IS THE SUBJECT OF LEGISLATIVE ACTION.**

19 **(II) THE LIMITATION UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS**
20 **PARAGRAPH ON REPRESENTATION BY A FORMER STATE OFFICIAL OR PUBLIC**
21 **OFFICIAL OF THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH DOES NOT APPLY TO THE FORMER**
22 **OFFICIAL'S REPRESENTATION OF A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION, COUNTY, OR**
23 **STATE GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY.**

24 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
25 October 1, 2009.
