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## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Criminal Procedure – Criminal Injuries Compensation Board – Claimant**  
3 **Confidentiality and Eligibility**

4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting the disclosure of the identity or contact information of  
5 a victim or claimant by the Criminal Injuries Compensation Board; prohibiting  
6 a person who has been convicted of certain offenses from receiving a certain  
7 award from the Board; and generally relating to the Criminal Injuries  
8 Compensation Board.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 **Article – Criminal Procedure**

17 11–806.

18 (a) Except as provided under [subsection] **SUBSECTIONS (b) AND (C)** of this  
19 section, the record of a proceeding before the Board or a Board member is a public  
20 record.

21 (b) If the confidentiality of a record or report that the Board obtains is  
22 protected by law or regulation, the record or report shall remain confidential, subject  
23 to the law or regulation.

3 **NUMBER, OR SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER PROVIDED TO THE BOARD.**

5           (a) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, the  
6 following persons are eligible for awards in the manner provided under this subtitle:

3                   (2)    [A] **THE FOLLOWING PERSONS ARE NOT ELIGIBLE FOR AN**  
4 **AWARD UNDER THIS SUBTITLE:**

5                   (I)    A person who commits the crime or delinquent act that is  
6 the basis of a claim, or an accomplice of the person, is not eligible to receive an award  
7 with respect to [the] **THAT** claim; **AND**

8                   (II)   **A PERSON WHO HAS EVER BEEN CONVICTED OF:**

9                   1.    **A VIOLATION OF § 1-301 (ACCESSORY AFTER THE**  
10 **FACT TO A FELONY) OF THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE;**

11                   2.    **MURDER OR ATTEMPTED MURDER UNDER §**  
12 **2-201, § 2-204, § 2-205, OR § 2-206 OF THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE;**

13                   3.    **ASSAULT UNDER § 3-202 OR § 3-203 OF THE**  
14 **CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE;**

15                   4.    **ATTEMPTED POISONING UNDER § 3-212 OF THE**  
16 **CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE;**

17                   5.    **CONTAMINATING A WATER SUPPLY OR FOOD OR**  
18 **DRINK UNDER § 3-214 OF THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE;**

19                   6.    **A SEXUAL OFFENSE UNDER § 3-303, § 3-304, §**  
20 **3-305, § 3-306, § 3-307, § 3-309, § 3-310, § 3-311, § 3-312, § 3-315, § 3-321, §**  
21 **3-323, § 3-324, OR § 3-602 OF THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE;**

22                   7.    **ROBBERY UNDER § 3-402 OR § 3-403 OF THE**  
23 **CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE;**

24                   8.    **CARJACKING UNDER § 3-405 OF THE CRIMINAL**  
25 **LAW ARTICLE;**

26                   9.    **KIDNAPPING UNDER § 3-502 OF THE CRIMINAL**  
27 **LAW ARTICLE;**

28                   10. **CHILD KIDNAPPING UNDER § 3-503 OF THE**

15 JUROR, OR COURT OFFICER INTIMIDATION) OF THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE;

16 18. ESCAPE UNDER § 9-404 OF THE CRIMINAL LAW  
17 ARTICLE; OR

18 19. A VIOLATION OF TITLE 20, SUBTITLE 6 (FEMALE  
19 GENITAL MUTILATION) OF THE HEALTH - GENERAL ARTICLE.
