A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Queen Anne's County – County Commissioners – Gaming Permits**

3 FOR the purpose of repealing a certain limitation on the number of permits to operate
4 gaming devices that the County Commissioners for Queen Anne's County may
5 issue to an organization in a single year; authorizing the county commissioners
6 to determine the number of permits to issue to an organization in a single year;
7 and generally relating to permits to operate gaming devices in Queen Anne's
8 County.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 **Article – Criminal Law**

22 13–2002.

23 (a) This subtitle applies only in Queen Anne's County.

24 13–2003.

1 (a) An organization listed in subsection (b) of this section shall obtain a
2 permit from the county commissioners before the organization may use two or more of
3 the following gaming devices in conducting a fundraiser at which prizes of
4 merchandise or money may be awarded:

5 (1) a paddle wheel;

6 (2) a wheel of fortune;

7 (3) a chance book;

8 (4) a card game;

9 (5) a raffle; or

10 (6) any other gaming device.

11 (d) (3) The county commissioners may [not issue more than two permits]
12 **DETERMINE THE NUMBER OF PERMITS TO ISSUE** to an organization in a single
13 year.

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
15 July 1, 2010.
