CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Higher Education – Exemption from Tuition for Foster Care Recipients –**
3 **Eligibility Age**

4 FOR the purpose of altering the age before which foster care recipients must be
5 enrolled at public institutions of higher education to be exempt from paying
6 certain tuition; altering the age before which foster care recipients must be
7 enrolled as candidates for certain degrees to not be required to pay the
8 difference between the amount of certain scholarships or grants and the
9 amount of certain tuition; and generally relating to the age of foster care
10 recipients to be eligible for exemptions from paying tuition.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article – Education**

2 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

3 (2) (i) “Foster care recipient” means an individual who:

4 1. Was placed in an out-of-home placement by the
5 Maryland Department of Human Resources; and

6 2. A. Resided in an out-of-home placement in the
7 State at the time the individual graduated from high school or successfully completed
8 a general equivalency development examination (GED); or

9 B. Resided in an out-of-home placement in the State on
10 the individual’s 13th birthday and was adopted out of an out-of-home placement after
11 the individual’s 13th birthday.

12 (ii) “Foster care recipient” includes a younger sibling of an
13 individual described in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph if the younger sibling is
14 concurrently adopted out of an out-of-home placement by the same adoptive family.

15 (3) “Out-of-home placement” has the meaning stated in § 5-501 of the
16 Family Law Article.

17 (4) (i) “Tuition” means the charges imposed by a public institution
18 of higher education for enrollment at the institution.

19 (ii) “Tuition” includes charges for registration and all fees
20 required as a condition of enrollment.

21 (b) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a foster care
22 recipient is exempt from paying tuition at a public institution of higher education if:

23 (i) The foster care recipient is enrolled at the institution on or
24 before the date that the foster care recipient reaches the age of [21] 25 years;

25 (ii) The foster care recipient is enrolled as a candidate for an
26 associate’s degree or a bachelor’s degree; and

27 (iii) The foster care recipient has filed for federal and State
28 financial aid by March 1 each year.

29 (2) If a foster care recipient receives a scholarship or grant for
30 postsecondary study and is enrolled before the recipient’s [21st] 25TH birthday as a
31 candidate for an associate’s degree or bachelor’s degree at a public institution of higher

1 education, the foster care recipient may not be required to pay the difference between
2 the amount of the scholarship or grant and the amount of the tuition.

3 (3) A foster care recipient who is exempt from tuition under this
4 section continues to be exempt until the earlier of:

5 (i) 5 years after first enrolling as a candidate for an associate's
6 degree or a bachelor's degree at a public institution of higher education in the State; or

7 (ii) The date that the foster care recipient is awarded a
8 bachelor's degree.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
10 July 1, 2011.
