CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Workers' Compensation – Emergency Responders – Revisions**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the definition of “on duty” in the workers’ compensation
4 law to include the performance of certain duties assigned to certain individuals
5 appointed as deputy sheriffs or members of a certain fire police unit; altering
6 the definition of “volunteer company” to include a volunteer fire police unit;
7 specifying that a certain yearly stipend to help offset out-of-pocket expenses
8 that is paid to certain emergency responders may not be used when determining
9 the average weekly wage of the members for workers’ compensation purposes;
10 specifying that certain emergency responders who receive a certain membership
11 benefit may not be considered *paid covered* employees ~~for a certain purpose~~
12 based on receipt of a certain membership benefit; and generally relating to
13 workers’ compensation for emergency responders.

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
 12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 **Article – Labor and Employment**

14 9–234.

15 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

16 (2) (i) “On duty” means:

17 1. fighting a fire;

18 2. performing a duty of a member of an advanced life
 19 support unit or an ambulance, first aid, or rescue squad in a volunteer company;

20 3. except as provided in subparagraph (ii) of this
 21 paragraph, performing a duty that the volunteer company assigns to the member;

22 4. performing a duty that a written bylaw or rule of
 23 government adopted for the volunteer company assigns to the member;

24 5. going to or from performing a duty included under
 25 item 1, 2, 3, or 4 of this subparagraph;

26 6. accompanying an accident or fire victim while being
 27 transported to a hospital in a helicopter; [or]

28 7. returning to the home station of the individual after
 29 accompanying a victim under item 6 of this subparagraph;

30 **8. PERFORMING A DUTY ASSIGNED TO A MEMBER OF**
 31 **A FIRE COMPANY APPOINTED AS A DEPUTY SHERIFF UNDER § 7–302 OR § 7–303**
 32 **OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY ARTICLE; OR**

1 **9. PERFORMING A DUTY ASSIGNED TO AN**
2 **INDIVIDUAL APPOINTED TO SERVE AS A MEMBER OF THE FIRE POLICE IN**
3 **WASHINGTON COUNTY UNDER § 7-304 OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY ARTICLE.**

4 (ii) “On duty” does not include attendance of a member of a
5 volunteer company at a social function unless a written bylaw or rule of government
6 adopted for the volunteer company requires the attendance or participation of the
7 member.

8 (3) “Volunteer company” means:

9 (i) a volunteer advanced life support unit;

10 (ii) a volunteer ambulance company or squad;

11 (iii) a volunteer fire company or department; ~~and~~

12 (iv) a volunteer rescue company, department, or squad; AND

13 **(V) A VOLUNTEER FIRE POLICE UNIT.**

14 (b) An individual who is a covered employee under subsection (h)(2), (k), (n),
15 (o)(2), (p)(1)(ii), (r)(3), (v), or (x)(1) of this section continues to be a covered employee
16 while:

17 (1) accompanying an accident or fire victim who is being transported
18 to a hospital in a helicopter; and

19 (2) returning to the home station of the individual after accompanying
20 a victim under item (1) of this subsection.

21 (c) (1) Unless an election is made under paragraph (2) of this subsection,
22 a member of a volunteer company in Allegany County is not a covered employee.

23 (2) The Board of County Commissioners for Allegany County may
24 provide by resolution for members of a volunteer company in the county to be covered
25 employees while on duty.

26 (d) A member of a volunteer company in Anne Arundel County is a covered
27 employee while on duty.

28 (e) A member of a volunteer company in Baltimore County is a covered
29 employee while on duty.

1 (f) A member of a volunteer company in Calvert County is a covered
2 employee while on duty.

3 (g) A member of a volunteer company in Caroline County is a covered
4 employee while on duty.

5 (h) (1) Unless an election is made in accordance with this subsection, a
6 member of a volunteer company in Carroll County is not a covered employee.

7 (2) A volunteer fire company in Carroll County may elect to make its
8 members covered employees.

9 (3) A volunteer fire company that elects to make its members covered
10 employees shall pay the premium for the coverage.

11 (i) (1) A member of a volunteer company in Cecil County who meets the
12 guidelines set under paragraph (2) of this subsection is a covered employee while on
13 duty.

14 (2) The Board of County Commissioners of Cecil County may set
15 guidelines to determine the eligibility of members of a volunteer company in the
16 county for coverage under this subsection.

17 (3) The guidelines under paragraph (2) of this subsection may not
18 limit the number of covered employees in a volunteer company.

19 (j) (1) Unless an election is made in accordance with this subsection, a
20 member of a volunteer company in Charles County is not a covered employee.

21 (2) The Board of County Commissioners of Charles County may
22 provide by resolution for members of a volunteer company in the county to be covered
23 employees while on duty.

24 (k) A member of a volunteer company in Dorchester County is a covered
25 employee.

26 (l) A member of a volunteer company in Frederick County is a covered
27 employee while on duty.

28 (m) (1) Unless an election is made under paragraph (2) of this subsection,
29 a member of a volunteer company in Garrett County is not a covered employee.

30 (2) The Board of County Commissioners for Garrett County may
31 provide by resolution for members of a volunteer company in the county to be covered
32 employees while on duty.

1 (n) A member of a volunteer company in Harford County is a covered
2 employee.

3 (o) An individual is a covered employee:

4 (1) while on duty as an actively participating member of a volunteer
5 company in Howard County; or

6 (2) if not covered under item (1) of this subsection, while a member of
7 a volunteer company in Howard County participating in the activities of the volunteer
8 company.

9 (p) (1) An individual is a covered employee:

10 (i) while on duty as an actively participating member of a
11 volunteer company in Kent County; or

12 (ii) if not covered under item (i) of this paragraph, while a
13 member of a volunteer company in Kent County.

14 (2) The Board of County Commissioners of Kent County shall impose
15 annually a tax on assessable property in the county in an amount that is sufficient to
16 pay for coverage under this subsection.

17 (3) The Board of County Commissioners of Kent County may limit the
18 number of members in a volunteer company in the county.

19 (q) A member of a volunteer company in Montgomery County is a covered
20 employee while on duty.

21 (r) An individual is a covered employee:

22 (1) while on duty as a member of the Laurel volunteer rescue squad in
23 Prince George's County; or

24 (2) while a member of a volunteer company in Prince George's County.

25 (s) A member of a volunteer company in Queen Anne's County is a covered
26 employee while on duty.

27 (t) (1) Unless an election is made under paragraph (2) of this subsection,
28 a member of a volunteer company in St. Mary's County is not a covered employee.

29 (2) The Board of County Commissioners for St. Mary's County may
30 provide by resolution for the members of a volunteer company in the county to be
31 covered employees while on duty.

1 (u) (1) Unless an election is made under paragraph (2) of this subsection,
2 a member of a volunteer company in Somerset County is not a covered employee.

3 (2) The Board of County Commissioners for Somerset County may
4 provide by resolution for members of a volunteer company in the county to be covered
5 employees while on duty.

6 (v) (1) A member of a volunteer company in Talbot County is a covered
7 employee.

8 (2) The County Council of Talbot County may provide by resolution for
9 members of a volunteer company in the county to be covered employees while on duty.

10 (w) (1) Unless an election is made under paragraph (2) of this subsection,
11 a member of a volunteer company in Washington County is not a covered employee.

12 (2) The Board of County Commissioners for Washington County may
13 provide by resolution for members of a volunteer company in the county to be covered
14 employees while on duty.

15 (x) (1) A member of a volunteer company in Wicomico County is a covered
16 employee.

17 (2) The County Council of Wicomico County may provide by resolution
18 for members of a volunteer company in the county to be covered employees while on
19 duty.

20 (y) (1) Unless an election is made under paragraph (2) of this subsection,
21 a member of a volunteer company in Worcester County is not a covered employee.

22 (2) The Board of County Commissioners for Worcester County may
23 provide by resolution for members of a volunteer company in the county to be covered
24 employees while on duty.

25 (z) (1) For the purposes of this title, a member of a volunteer company
26 who is a covered employee under this section is an employee of the political
27 subdivision of the State where the volunteer company is organized.

28 (2) A member of a volunteer company shall be covered while on duty
29 by a policy of workers' compensation insurance.

30 **(AA) A MEMBER OF A VOLUNTEER COMPANY WHO IS ~~NOT~~ A COVERED**
31 **EMPLOYEE UNDER THIS SECTION MAY NOT ~~OTHERWISE~~ BE CONSIDERED A PAID**
32 **COVERED EMPLOYEE OF THE VOLUNTEER COMPANY FOR RECEIVING AS A**
33 **MEMBERSHIP BENEFIT A YEARLY STIPEND OF \$5,200 OR LESS TO HELP OFFSET**
34 **OUT-OF-POCKET EXPENSES.**

2 (a) (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the average weekly
3 wage of a covered employee shall be computed by determining the average of the
4 weekly wages of the covered employee:

5 (i) when the covered employee is working full time; and

6 (ii) at the time of:

7 1. the accidental personal injury; or

8 2. the last injurious exposure of the covered employee to
9 the hazards of an occupational disease.

10 (2) For purposes of a computation under paragraph (1) of this
11 subsection, wages shall include:

12 (i) tips; and

13 (ii) the reasonable value of housing, lodging, meals, rent, and
14 other similar advantages that the covered employee received from the employer.

15 (3) If a covered employee establishes that, because of the age and
16 experience of the covered employee at the time of the accidental personal injury or last
17 injurious exposure to the hazards of the occupational disease, the wages of the covered
18 employee could be expected to increase under normal circumstances, the expected
19 increase may be taken into account when computing the average weekly wage of the
20 covered employee under paragraph (1) of this subsection.

21 (g) (1) **[For] SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, FOR**
22 the purpose of computing the average weekly wage of an individual who is a covered
23 employee under § 9-234 of this title, the wages of the covered employee shall be:

24 **[(1)](I)** for a covered employee who received a salary or wages from
25 other employment at the time of the accidental personal injury or last injurious
26 exposure, the salary or wages from the other employment; or

27 **[(2)](II)** for a covered employee who did not receive a salary or wages
28 from other employment at the time of the accidental personal injury or last injurious
29 exposure:

30 **[(i)] 1.** if the covered employee derived income from a source
31 other than salary or wages at the time of the accidental personal injury or last

1 injurious exposure, an amount that allows the maximum compensation under this
2 title;

3 [(ii)] 2. if the covered employee was not engaged in a business
4 enterprise at the time of the accidental personal injury or last injurious exposure, the
5 weekly income last received by the covered employee when engaged in a business
6 enterprise; or

7 [(iii)] 3. if the covered employee had never been engaged in a
8 business enterprise at the time of the accidental personal injury or last injurious
9 exposure, an amount that allows the minimum compensation under this title.

10 (2) A YEARLY STIPEND OF \$5,200 OR LESS TO HELP OFFSET
11 OUT-OF-POCKET EXPENSES THAT A VOLUNTEER ~~ADVANCED LIFE SUPPORT~~
12 ~~UNIT, VOLUNTEER AMBULANCE COMPANY, VOLUNTEER FIRE COMPANY,~~
13 ~~VOLUNTEER FIRE POLICE UNIT, OR VOLUNTEER RESCUE SQUAD~~ COMPANY, AS
14 DEFINED IN § 9-234 OF THIS TITLE, PAYS TO A MEMBER MAY NOT BE USED
15 WHEN DETERMINING THE AVERAGE WEEKLY WAGE OF THE MEMBER.

16 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
17 October 1, 2012.
